1. Our contact details

2. What type of information we have

We collect the following information from you:

- Full name
- Company
- Job Title
- Email address

3. How we get the information and why do we have it

We get the information directly from you on our website when register your interest in attending one of our events. We are keeping the information so that we can keep in touch with you in relation to the event you register to attend. Under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the lawful basis we rely on for processing your personal data is consent. We do not share your information with anyone else.

4. What we do with the information

We keep the information on our systems so that we can keep a record of who is interested in our events, when we last contacted them and to ensure that they still want to hear from us.

5. How the Firm protects data

The Firm takes the security of your data seriously. The Firm has internal policies and controls in place to prevent your data being lost, accidentally destroyed, misused or disclosed and is not accessed except by a restricted number of the UNW team in the performance of their duties.

6. How long we keep the data

We will keep the data only for as long as it is needed for the purposes described in section 3 "How we get the information and why do we have it" and for a maximum of two years after we last have contact with you. If you inform us that you are no longer interested in attending our events, we will delete your data.

7. Your data protection rights

You have rights under Data Protection law – for example you can ask us to delete all your data and/or correct it if there are errors in it.
